Ronnie Murray was born on the 12th March 1928. He joined the Aberdeen Tailors' Incorporation on 27th February 1951, having been introduced to the Trade by his father.. His essay piece was to cut a suit of men's clothes and make one garment, the applicant bound himself to execute within 6 weeks. Late Deacon Abernethy and Norman Meldrum were appointed Essay Masters with Boxmaster George Murray as Oversman. He was a member of the Trade for 54 years.

Ronnie went through office, serving as Deacon on two separate occasions and then went on to serve as Deacon Convener of the Seven Incorporated Trades from October 1970 until October 1972. He was also a Manager of the James Milne's Mortification fund for a number of years which provides an education bursary to sons of Tailors between the ages of 16 and 21 years.

Outside the Incorporated Trades, Ronnie was an Elder at St Machars' Cathedral and was involved in the running of church activities.
